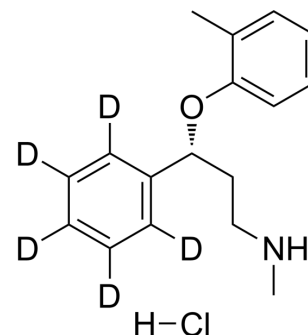


## Atomoxetine-d<sub>5</sub> hydrochloride

### BIOLOGICAL ACTIVITY

<b>Description</b>	Atomoxetine-d <sub>5</sub> (hydrochloride) is the deuterium labeled Atomoxetine hydrochloride. Atomoxetine hydrochloride is a potent and selective noradrenalin re-uptake inhibitor (K <sub>i</sub> values are 5, 77 and 1451 nM for inhibition of radioligand binding to human NET, SERT and DAT respectively)[1][2].
<b>In Vitro</b>	Stable heavy isotopes of hydrogen, carbon, and other elements have been incorporated into drug molecules, largely as tracers for quantitation during the drug development process. Deuteration has gained attention because of its potential to affect the pharmacokinetic and metabolic profiles of drugs <sup>[1]</sup> . MCE has not independently confirmed the accuracy of these methods. They are for reference only.
